


From the President's Desk

Remembering the 50th Anniversary of CPT Harry Q. Rose's Ultimate Sacrifice

CPT Harry Q. Rose was a 1966 graduate of the Virginia National Guard's Officer Candidate School OCS Class VIII, and the Honor Graduate of his Field Artillery Officer Basic Course. Born in Caples, West Virginia on 21 July 1943, he enlisted in the Virginia National Guard in 1965, and served with the 6th Howitzer Battalion, 111th Artillery in Northern Virginia, where he and his family resided. Following his Virginia OCS graduation, CPT Rose joined the 101st Airborne Division at Fort Campbell in Kentucky, completed the Army Aviation School, and served with the 116th Assault Helicopter Company in South Vietnam. It was 50 years ago on 21 February 1969 that CPT Rose was killed in the South Vietnamese province of Hua Nghia. He was awarded the Purple Heart, Silver Star, Distinguished Flying Cross, Bronze Star, Air Medal with Two Oak Leaf Clusters, and the Army Commendation Medal with V-Device. CPT Rose is the only Virginia OCS graduate to die in combat, and to this date a leadership award is given in his honor to one of the Virginia OCS graduating officer candidates who exhibits remarkable leadership skills during the three phases of OCS training. Last September, the Virginia OCS Class LX organized a ceremony to dedicate the Virginia OCS main building at Fort Pickett in honor of CPT Rose.

An Update On Your SSLI (State Sponsored Life Insurance) Program

The SSLI program is a valuable benefit for the members of the Virginia National Guard and their dependents. Every member is provided a \$1,000 death benefit at no cost to the member while a member of the Virginia National Guard. This program is endorsed by the Virginia National Guard Association (VNGA) and the Virginia Army and Air National Guard Enlisted Association (VaA/ANGEA), your two professional National Guard military associations.

The program is the only one authorized for the Payroll Deduction slot from your National Guard Pay by the Congress of the United States. Authorized enrollers brief the benefits of the Basic SSLI and Enhanced SSLI available at unit assemblies, annual training, and readiness preparedness functions in preparation for deployment. If the member is present for one of these briefings they are guaranteed to be able to enroll for up to \$10,000 of coverage regardless of health and can enroll their spouse as well regardless of health. They may also enroll for additional coverage amounts at the briefings.

This valuable coverage has no geographic restriction, no war clause, no aviation clause, no hazardous duty clause, and for the Basic SSLI (guarantee issue amount) no suicide clause. The additional coverage does have an industry standard 2 -year suicide clause. The coverages are very competitive and you can retain the coverage after separation or retirement up to age 70.

Claims are usually payable to the beneficiary within 24 hours of receipt of the notice of death by the administrator's office. Last year our pool paid 19 claims for insured members or dependents in Virginia. Our SSLI group of participating states paid out \$1,046,500 in 170 claims under the Basic SSLI, and an additional \$7,826,836 in 50 claims under the Enhanced SSLI last year.

In order to make sure the proper beneficiaries and coverages are recorded as the member desires, it is necessary for the authorized briefers for our program to have access to the members at the units. We try to schedule annual briefings with the units to provide updated information and coverage choices, opportunities for new unit members to enroll, and to provide assistance with changes desired.

So as you can see, your SSLI program provides real benefits at a most difficult and critical time for families dealing with the loss of loved ones. The SSLI program insurance carrier is Armed Forces Benefit Association (AFBA).

NGAUS and **EANGUS** Member Benefits

Dues-paying members and life members of the NGAUS and the Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States, or EANGUS, have an accidental death and dismemberment (AD&D) benefit at no extra cost to the member.

NGAUS and EANGUS members under the age of 80 are automatically enrolled for \$2,500 in accidental death and dismemberment coverage. The NGAUS Insurance Trust trustees voted during their October 1998 meeting to reestablish the benefit.

This \$2,500 benefit, will automatically cover all members under age 80 whose national dues have been received or accounted for by their respective national association headquarters. There are no other enrollment requirements for the member to be covered.

For the claim to be paid, the NGAUS or EANGUS headquarters must receive the completed claim form (https://www.ngaus.org/insurance/enrollment-and-claims-forms) and verify that the dues of "deceased/claimant" are current. Once the appropriate national headquarters is notified of a pending claim, they will verify membership and document it appropriately on the claim form. The claim form will then be forwarded to the claimant for completion. The completed form and any other required documents should then be returned to the NGAUSIT address on the form for processing by the insurance company.

The AD&D benefit is viewed as a significant addition to the membership package for the two associations. The membership at large can be of great service by notifying the NGAUS and EANGUS headquarters whenever there is a death of a member. This will assist us in making sure that a benefit due to a Guard member's beneficiary is not overlooked.


VaA/ANGEA Presidential Cliff Notes

A Shared Patch

Virginia'a National Guard Air Force and Army Joint Force

ith the recent decision by the US
Air Force to
adopt the Army's Operational Camouflage Pattern
(OCP) uniform, the airmen
and soldiers assigned to
joint-force organizations
began wearing the same
uniform as of 1 October

(L same JFI sa

2018. In some cases, airmen and soldiers began wearing the same shoulder patch. One such organization is the Virginia National Guard's Joint-Force Headquarters where the soldiers and airmen assigned to the staff both wear the same patch on their left sleeve.

There will still be a few differences, however. Air Force and Air National Guard uniforms will have their name tapes and some ranks embroidered in "spice-brown" thread while the Army uniforms will continue to use black thread embroidery.

With the advent of the OCP uniform, new versions of a unit's shoulder patches were required to reflect the new baseline colors of the OCP. The new patches, as can be seen in the accompanying photo, are fairly similar in color to the old "Woodland" pattern subdued patches, but now, they come with the Velcro backing. They may also be sewn directly to the uniform.

(LEFT) The more things change, the more they remain the same: The newer OCP version of the Virginia National Guard JFHQ patch is shown (on the right). For comparison, a BDU sample from the period when the same patch represented the Virginia State Area Readiness Command (STARC) is shown on the left.

While the uniform changes by both services since the Air Force split off from the Army in September 1947 are numerous, it appears, for now, the two will once again share very similar uniforms reflecting the joint nature of their deployed operations. •
